## COLLEGE STUDENTS

Admission into a health program has two phases. First, you must meet the general admissions requirements. Second, you must be selected through the competitive process to be admitted into your desired program. Please take a few moments to review the <u>slide show</u> that will explain the competitive process in more detail. Further, after you have completed general admission requirements, it is highly recommended that you speak with a counselor to discuss in detail the selection process as quickly as possible.

### Phase I

All students are required to submit an FTCC application. Please complete all sections so that your application can be processed quickly and accurately. You may submit your <u>application</u> online, print, mail, fax or drop it off in person at the Admissions Office. You should begin the <u>application</u> process for Financial Aid and/or VA benefits as soon as you submit your FTCC application. For both Financial Aid and VA benefits, application deadlines are enforced. All Health Programs require the completion of the Accuplacer Assessment Test. Contact the Testing Office for an appointment at 910-678-8417 or at mitchelr@faytechcc.edu. You may also speak with a counselor about possible waivers. Submit an official high school transcript or official GED scores and all official transcripts from colleges and/or universities you have attended. You must complete the <u>Transcript Request Form</u> and mail it to the institution for your transcripts to send to FTCC. You should contact the institutions, because a fee may be required for transcripts.

### Phase II

Apply for your program of choice with <u>Counseling Services</u> at Main Campus, 910-678-0036 or <u>murraya@faytechcc.edu</u>, or <u>Spring Lake</u> (910-678-1003) or <u>castleml@faytechcc.edu</u> by January 30. Your eligibility will be determined by evaluating your assessment scores and transcripts. Your quality points will be calculated based upon the college courses you have completed with a "C" or better. For eligible health program candidates, attending the Health Program Information Session is mandatory. During the month of April you should receive a letter from the Department Chair informing you of the time and place the session will be held. By attending this mandatory session you may receive up to 15 points at the session. Based upon the recommendations of the specific Health Department Chair, the Director of Admissions will select the applicants with the highest number of points to be admitted for each health curriculum. Each Health Program applicant will be notified of their selection or denial on or about the first week of May.
