Student Satisfaction.

Whether students are interested in earning an associate degree, transferring to a four-year college, earning a technical or vocational certificate, or participating in life-long learning opportunities, Fayetteville Technical Community College has over 160 different programs to meet the needs of students and help students achieve success in the workforce. FTCC graduates report a 100% achievement rate for their goals and a 97% satisfaction rate with the overall quality of the College. During the 2007-08 school year, FTCC served over 26,000 curriculum students and over 25,000 continuing education students. FTCC is home to the largest continuing education program in the state.

Employer Satisfaction.

Employers are equally satisfied with FTCC graduates, responding to surveys with a 98% confidence level that they would hire future FTCC graduates. FTCC graduates play an integral role in the community by filling the employment needs of employers. FTCC graduates are employed by some of the community's major employers, such as Cape Fear Valley Health System, Cumberland County Schools, Veterans Administration Medical Center, Lamar, Fayetteville Publishing Company, the Department of Defense and the U.S. Army. Curriculum graduates from 38 FTCC programs achieved a 100% employment rate within their chosen occupations/fields.

Leader in Innovative Technology.

FTCC partnered with Navigator Development Group to provide cutting-edge i3D visual technology to area high school students. Through a grant from the GoldenLEAF Foundation provided by the help of the Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) group, FTCC expanded the virtual network of the All American Center for Workforce innovation. As a result of this effort, high school students from 11 surrounding counties will experience the excitement of interactive 3D technology in the classroom.
